BACKGROUND/PROPOSAL

Bylaw 01-2025, the Agricultural Service Board Bylaw, is presented for Council approval. The proposed changes relate to the composition of the Board. The current Bylaw provides for all of Council (which was previously 4 members) and 4 member-at-large positions.

The Agricultural Fieldman researched the composition of neighboring municipal ASB's and found that most take the approach of having a limited number of Councillors while having a larger number of member-at-large positions on the Board. As the ASB is an advisory board to Council, this composition approach demonstrates and promotes a greater focus on guidance by active or present producers in the municipality. Further, the increase in Council positions to 5 would bring the total number of board members to 9, which would increase expenses for meetings and attendance at conferences. Therefore, the Bylaw proposes the composition of the board change to up to four (4) Members-at-large, plus two (2) Councillors, to total six (6) Voting Members.

This Bylaw would replace Bylaw 07-2011, and all amendments thereto. Administration recommends that the Bylaw receive all three readings, should Council not have any further amendments.

Agricultural Service Board Bylaw BYLAW NO. 07-2011

A BYLAW of the Municipal District of Spirit River No. 133, in the Province of Alberta, for the purpose of establishing an Agricultural Service Board.

WHEREAS, the Agricultural Service Board Act empower a Council to pass a bylaw to establish an Agricultural Service Board; and

WHEREAS, the council of the Municipal District of Spirit River No. 133 has determined it is in the best interest of the municipality to pass such a bylaw.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Municipal District of Spirit River No. 133, duly assembled, enacts the following:

- The Agricultural Service Board for the Municipal District of Spirit River No. 133 will be an advisory committee consisting of 4 voting Council members, 3 voting members at large, one non-voting Alberta Agriculture, Food and Rural Development representative and one non-voting Agricultural Fieldman.
- 2. The Chairman of the Agricultural Service Board shall be elected at the first Agricultural Service Board after the Council's Organizational meeting, with all voting members eligible for the position.
- 3. The duration of the term for the Agricultural Service Board members will be one year, coinciding with the Organizational meeting of Council.
- 4. Selection of all the Agricultural Service Board members at large will occur during the Organizational meeting of Council, and will be based on agricultural experience and agricultural community involvement of the candidate.
- 5. All Agricultural Service Board members at large shall be agricultural producers and reside within the boundaries of the Municipal District of Spirit River No. 133 at the time of selection and for the duration of the term of appointment.
- 6. A person who is a member of the Agricultural Service Board member at large ceases to be a member of the Agricultural Service Board if, without being authorized by a resolution of the Agricultural Service Board, the member is absent from 3 consecutive meetings of the Agricultural Service Board.
- 7. Bylaw No. 15-2001, is repealed.
- 8. This Bylaw shall be effective on the date of its final passing.

- 2. That this bylaw shall come into force and take effect upon the Third and Final Reading thereof.

Agricultural Service Board Bylaw

BYLAW NO 01 - 2025

PURPOSE: Being a Bylaw to establish an Agricultural Service Board (ASB).

WHEREAS, Section 3 of the Agricultural Service Board Act, Revised Statutes of Alberta 2000, Chapter A-10 authorizes Council to pass a bylaw establishing a Board.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of Municipal District of Spirit River No.133, in the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. DEFINITIONS

- a. "Act" shall mean the *Agricultural Service Board Act, Revised Statutes of Alberta 2000, Chapter A-10*, as amended.
- b. "ASB" shall mean the Municipal District of Spirit River No.133 Agricultural Service Board.
- c. "Council" shall mean the Municipal District of Spirit River No.133 Council.
- d. "Municipal District" shall mean Municipal District of Spirit River No.133.
- e. "Agricultural Fieldman" shall be a qualified person appointed according to the Agricultural Service Board Act.
- 2. The Agricultural Service Board is hereby established.

3. MEMBERSHIP

- a. The ASB shall consist of:
 - i. up to four (4) Members-at-large, plus two (2) Councillors, to total six (6) Voting Members;
- b. The term of office for all members at large shall be two years with staggered membership rotation to ensure continuity;
- c. An attempt will be made to include members from differing sectors of the agriculture industry.
- d. The ASB shall select a Chair and Vice-Chair from the Voting Membership at the first meeting of the ASB following the Municipal Organizational Meeting each year.

e. Voting Members of the ASB shall be compensated in accordance with County Policy.

4. AUTHORITY

- a. The ASB is a Committee of Council and only has the authority to recommend action for Council consideration.
- b. The ASB is a forum for discussion.
- c. The ASB shall:
 - i. follow and comply with the Act;
 - ii. assist and advise Council on issues referred to the ASB by Council;
 - iii.provide advice and direction for the Agricultural Fieldman;
 - iv. As necessary, act as the appeal committee under the *Soil Conservation Act*;
 - v. prepare a Strategic Plan annually, for Council consideration;
 - vi. submit planning initiatives to meet the goals and objectives of the ASB Strategic Plan, for Council consideration;
 - vii. review, evaluate, develop, and prioritize projects:
 - viii. prepare the ASB Budget annually, for Council consideration;
 - ix. submit recommended policies and policy revisions, for Council consideration, to ensure Policies are current and meet the needs of the Municipality; and
 - x. annually submit a summary of the activities of the preceding year, for Council information.

5. MEETINGS

- a. Meetings shall be held a minimum of six times per year at a date and time as determined by the ASB.
- b. Meetings shall comply with the Municipal District Committee and Board Meeting Procedure Bylaw.
- c. A quorum shall constitute of a majority of voting members.

6. AGENDA

a. Members will be canvassed by the Agricultural Fieldman or designate as soon as is practicable prior to each meeting to establish a draft agenda. b. The Chair and the Agricultural Fieldman, or designate, will the draft agenda into a final agenda for each meeting.

7. RECORD KEEPING

a. Minutes shall be recorded at each meeting and maintained as an official record of the Municipal District.

8. RESOURCES

a. The Agricultural Fieldman or designate, is the principal advisor to the ASB. Attendance of specific Municipal District staff or guests is at the discretion of the Chair and Agricultural Fieldman.

9. COMING INTO FORCE

- a. This Bylaw shall come into force and effect upon the day of final passing and signing.
- b. Bylaw 07-2011 and any amendments thereto are hereby repealed.

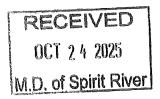

BACKGROUND/PROPOSAL

MA Connect is the Government of Alberta's secure portal for Municipal Affairs and is used by municipalities to access crucial web applications, including:

Compliance and Reporting: Financial and grant reporting is handled through this portal. Failure to access it results in missed deadlines, delayed funding, and non-compliance with provincial grant terms.

Grant Programs: Such as the Local Government Fiscal Framework (LGFF)

Reporting: Submitting financial and capital plans and statements.

Access is managed through a Stakeholder Administrator within the municipality. If only one person has access, the entire MD is locked out when they leave. Designating multiple key administrative staff (CAO, Assistant CAO, Director of Corporate Services) ensures business continuity and designating administrative and financial managers ensures that the staff responsible for grant management and financial oversight can actually perform their duties, aligning with your goal of transparency and control. In short, while the MGA doesn't name the technology, good governance—as mandated by the MGA—requires a formal, multi-user protocol for accessing critical provincial systems like MA Connect. The people responsible for financial execution (CAO, Assistant CAO, Director of Corporate Services) should all be designated users.

BACKGROUND The Municipal Government Act (MGA), specifically Section 203, authorizes Council to establish committees. As the Municipal District of Spirit River No. 133 continues to manage increasingly complex administrative and strategic matters, an informal, open forum is essential for effective governance.

The COW mechanism allows Council members to move past strict procedural rules (like limitations on debate) that govern regular Council meetings, enabling a thorough exploration of options, reports, and policies. This bylaw formalizes the COW's structure, ensuring the process remains transparent, predictable, and compliant with the MGA. The proposed Bylaw incorporates the following key elements to regulate the Committee of the Whole:

- 1. Establishment and Membership: Formally establishes the COW as a standing committee where all members of Council serve as members.
- 2. Non-Decision-Making Mandate: Clearly states that the COW shall not have the power to make final decisions, adopt bylaws, or pass binding resolutions. All outcomes are in the form of recommendations to be considered at a subsequent formal Council meeting.
- 3. Purpose: Its primary role is to review, discuss, and deliberate on administrative reports, strategic initiatives, and draft policies, and to receive presentations from Administration and Delegations.
- 4. Procedure: Meetings are generally governed by the Municipal Procedure Bylaw, but are modified to encourage discussion:
 - o Formal motions and seconds are prohibited (except for adopting a recommendation).
 - o Members have greater flexibility to speak on subjects.
- 5. Chair: The Chief Elected Official (Reeve) is designated as the Chair.
- 6. Openness: COW meetings shall be open to the public, consistent with the transparency requirements of the MGA, while retaining the right to move to closed session for confidential matters.

Impact

Governance Improves the efficiency and quality of Council's decision-making by allowing for thorough, informal review of matters prior to final voting.

Policy/Legal Ensures the establishment and conduct of the COW adheres to the requirements of the Municipal Government Act and the Municipality's main Procedure Bylaw.

Operational Formalizes a predictable schedule and process for Administration to present non-time-sensitive, complex reports and gather preliminary feedback from Council.

ransparency Confirms that COW meetings will be open to the public, increasing Council's overall accountability and transparency.

Bylaw No. 2025/02: Committee of the Whole Bylaw

A BYLAW TO ESTABLISH AND REGULATE A COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE

WHEREAS the Municipal Government Act, RSA 2000, c M-26, as amended (the "MGA"), permits Council to establish committees;

AND WHEREAS Council deems it desirable to establish a Committee of the Whole to provide procedures for the running of business and section 203 permits council to establish committees as an informal forum for discussion, deliberation, and receiving public input prior to making formal decisions at a regular Council meeting;

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Municipal District of Spirit River No.133 enacts as follows:

1. Citation

This Bylaw may be cited as the "Committee of the Whole Bylaw."

2. Definitions

2.1. Act means the Municipal Government Act, RSA 2000, c M-26, as amended. 2.2.

Council means the Council of [Name of Municipality/County]. 2.3. Committee of the Whole (COW) means the committee established under this Bylaw, composed of all members of Council. 2.4. Chief Elected Official (CEO) means the Reeve of the Municipality.

3. Establishment and Purpose

- 3.1. Council hereby establishes a standing committee known as the Committee of the Whole. 3.2. The primary purpose of the COW is to provide an opportunity for Council members to:
- a) Review, discuss, and deliberate on administrative reports, financial updates, strategic initiatives, and draft policies in an informal setting.
- b) Receive and discuss presentations from Administration, external partners, and Delegations, as necessary.
- c) Discuss items that require preliminary consensus or detailed review before being brought to a formal Council meeting for resolution or bylaw adoption.

3.3. The COW shall not have the power to make final decisions, adopt bylaws, or pass resolutions that bind the Municipality, except where Council, by resolution at a regular Council meeting, has specifically delegated such authority for a limited purpose.

All COW decisions shall take the form of recommendations to be considered at the next appropriate Council meeting.

4. Membership and Procedure

- 4.1. Membership: The membership of the COW shall consist of all members of Council.
- 4.2. Chairperson: The CEO (Reeve) shall be the Chair of the Committee of the Whole, and the Deputy Reeve shall act as Vice-Chairperson in the absence of the CEO.
- 4.3. Quorum: A quorum for a COW meeting shall be a majority of the members of Council.

4.4. Procedure:

COW meetings shall be governed by the Municipality's main Procedure Bylaw, except that:

- a) Formal motions and seconds are prohibited, with the focus being on open discussion and consensus building.
- b) Voting on a matter shall only be for the purpose of adopting a *recommendation* to Council.
- c) Members may speak more frequently on a subject than is permitted during a formal Council meeting.
- 4.5. Meetings: Meetings of the COW shall be scheduled as determined by Council or the CEO.

5. Openness and Confidentiality

5.1. COW meetings shall be open to the public, consistent with the requirements of the Act for Council meetings. 5.2. The COW may close a portion of the meeting to the public in accordance with the confidential exceptions set out in the Act (e.g., land, legal, or labour matters).

6. Repeal and Enactment

6.1. This Bylaw shall come into full force and effect upon the date of its third and final reading.

6.2. Effective Date This Bylaw shall come into effect upon the date of its third and final reading.

TERMS OF REFERENCE:

COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE

Purpose: To define the specific roles, responsibilities, and functions of the Reeve when serving as the Chairperson of the Committee of the Whole (COW), as established by Bylaw No. 2025/02 and in accordance with the Municipal Government Act, RSA 2000, c M-26 (MGA).

1. Authority and Mandate

- 1.1. Appointment: The Reeve shall serve as the Chairperson of the Committee of the Whole, as prescribed in Section 4.2 of Bylaw No. 2025/02.
- 1.2. Governing Principles: The Chairperson's conduct and the Committee's operation must align with the MGA, the Municipality's Procedure Bylaw, and the COW Bylaw.
- 1.3. Limited Authority: The Chairperson must continually ensure the Committee adheres to its mandate that it cannot make final decisions or bind the municipality, with all outcomes taking the form of formal recommendations to Council.

2. Core Responsibilities as Chairperson

2.1. Presiding Officer: To preside over all COW meetings to ensure orderly and efficient deliberation. 2.2. Agenda Management: To work collaboratively with the Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) to review and approve the COW agenda, ensuring items are appropriate for an informal discussion forum rather than a formal decision-making session. 2.3. Maintaining Purpose: To guide discussion and maintain focus on the COW's primary purpose: a) Preliminary review of administrative and strategic reports. b) Deliberation and consensus-building on complex issues. c) Receiving public input, delegations, and external presentations. 2.4. Procedural Control: To ensure the procedural rules specific to the COW are followed, particularly encouraging open discussion and discouraging reliance on formal motions, points of order, and strictly timed debates.

3. Facilitation and Discussion

3.1. Neutral Facilitator: To act as an impartial facilitator, encouraging participation from all Council members while managing the flow of discussion. 3.2. Managing Debate: To recognize speakers, regulate the length and relevance of comments, and ensure all members have a fair opportunity to contribute to the discussion. 3.3. Clarifying Recommendations: Where discussion concludes, the Chairperson must clearly articulate the consensus or the formal recommendation to be recorded in the minutes for subsequent consideration by Council.

4. Public Access and Confidentiality

4.1. Open Meetings: The Chairperson is responsible for ensuring the COW meeting is held in public unless the matter falls under the strict, legislated exceptions for closed sessions (in camera) as permitted by the MGA. 4.2. Closed Sessions: If the Committee resolves to move *in camera*, the Chairperson must ensure the reasons for the closed session are recorded and that only authorized topics are discussed while excluding the public. 4.3. Confidentiality: The Reeve must uphold confidentiality regarding any discussion held *in camera* during a COW meeting until it is officially discussed at a meeting held in public.

5. Accountability

5.1. The Reeve's performance as COW Chairperson is inherently linked to their overall performance as Chief Elected Official and is subject to the review and accountability mechanisms of the Council. 5.2. In the absence of the Reeve, the Deputy Reeve shall assume all responsibilities of the COW Chairperson.
